## Frequently Asked Questions

**Question:** How do I go about finding an articulation program for RN to Paramedic or for Paramedic to RN?

**Answer:** The PRNAK will post the training programs conducting articulation when the programs notify us that they have their program approved and when they will begin.

Until then, contact the training program you think you would like to attend and find out if it is conducting an articulation from RN to Paramedic or from Paramedic to RN. If so, find out its pre-entrance requirements and begin fulfilling those.

**Question:** When is it expected for the first articulation classes to be offered?

**Answer:** At present, there is indication that some schools will be ready by Fall, 2004 but continue to watch this website for more information once we have been notified that a program is ready.

**Question:** What if I have not been working as a Paramedic or a RN? Can I still take the articulation program?

**Answer:** That is up to the local program. However, the PRNAK's recommendation is that you can take the articulation program only if you have graduated from your paramedic or nursing program within the past 3 years or you can document that you have worked for a minimum of 1000 hours in your discipline within the past 3 years.

**Question:** Is there an articulation plan between LPNs and EMT-Basics?

**Answer:** The PRNAK is currently researching the feasibility of developing an articulation plan between LPNs and EMT-Basics. It is unknown at this time when additional information on this issue will be known.
